

1999: The Stoney Tribes legal action against the federal government (from 1990), compensated the Stoney Band with over 9-million dollars for "alienation" of the McDougall lands, mines and minerals. The agreement protects the government against further claims relating to the property, including the 43.9 acres held by the United Church. The Surrender (article 4) states ... "The Tribe hereby absolutely surrenders to Canada, pursuant to the provisions of sections 38 and 39 of the Indian Act, all rights and interests of whatsoever kind and nature which the Tribe and its members and their heirs, descendants, executors, successors and assigns, past, present and future, may have had, or may now have, in the lands described as follows: In Alberta: Plan 9310835 Block M, and Plan 8411089 Block A ... the Total Area being 43.9 acres more or less, including mines and minerals."
